<b>HOW ONE IS ISSUED</b>	Victim must file a Petition. Ex-parte order may be signed by Judge & will immediately go into effect without a hearing. Final orders may require a hearing if requested.	Victim must file a Petition. Ex-parte order may be signed by Judge & will immediately go into effect without hearing. Final orders may require a hearing.	Issued in a criminal case by a Judge at the request of the Prosecutor with or without the knowledge or consent of the victim. <b>EFFECTIVE PERIOD OF ORDER</b>	Up to 2 years (please see §518B.01, subd. 6, for circumstances justifying extensions and extended periods of protection, up to 50 years).	Up to 2 years (please see §609.748, subd 5, for circumstances permitting an order effective up to 50 years)	During the pendency of the case and during probation, if ordered by the sentencing court;	Pretrial DANCO: during pendency of criminal case Probationary DANCO: until probation expires
<b>POLICE ARREST AUTHORITY</b>	Police <b>shall</b> arrest without a warrant if they have probable cause to believe that the Order has been violated <b>and</b> that the suspect knew about the Order. Police do not need to witness the violation and the arrest may take place in the suspect's home. 518B.01.14(e)	Police <b>shall</b> arrest without a warrant if they have probable cause to believe that the Order has been violated <b>and</b> the officer has verified the Order. 609.748.6(e)	Police may arrest	Police <b>shall</b> arrest without a warrant if they have probable cause to believe that the Order has been violated, even if the violation did not occur in the presence of the officer. 629.75.2(b)
